1. Mesa Park Pavilion(s) Project:
 - Advanced payment request is submitted - pending roughly 75-85K, remaining 175K
 - Design - incorporating pool into the design down the road
 - Reed Gilliland & SJLA - prime contractors on design and implementation

 2. April:
 1. Sierra Dierks post asked about a pool on NextDoor, wanting a West Community Pool – have engaged mentors in the community
 2. 60% of residents are over 60, serve people with needs, young and old, envision it as a multi-generational gathering place.
 3. Would like to partner in some way moving forward with the Board
 4. So far they have had one meeting, collecting data on the cost, climates similar to Bolinas, in coordination with the BPUD regarding the water question & proposed budgets. Once they have all the data collected they will put out a larger survey.
 5. Fundraising, grants, etc.
 3. Ana worked on this more than 10 years ago, what they found people were willing to pay a monthly or annual fee to have access to the pool, that revenue could have sustained the pool then, but the big money to build it...has to drive to Mill Valley, would be lovely to have a facility here.

4. Mark – enough interest and willingness to pay user fees. San Geronimo/Woodacre – community pool – how did that project get funded initially.
 5. Dave – money, fully into it, but massive funding needed.
 6. Jennie – started on this project a long time ago, housing funds? Senior services? Community engagement with Bolinas/Stinson. Advisory poll was YES, and again with a survey. Affordable housing for a worker/lifeguard.
